

The Simple Truth about failed prophecies

300,000 in one meeting in Africa:

On July 13, 1952 William Branham first mentions a vision of a massive meeting in South Africa:

"And I heard Him scream with a Voice that shook me from the vision. Said, "There'll be three hundred thousand of them in that meeting. **THUS SAITH THE LORD!** Mark it in your book."

On April 27, 1965, in a sermon titled "**Does God Change His Mind?**", William Branham tells of the coming fulfillment of this vision:

"I'm going to South Africa after this. For, oh, my, you know how it is down there where you can't even talk to the people... We're at least expecting three hundred thousand, one single meeting.

On July 11, 1965 in a sermon titled "**Ashamed**", William Branham admits that the vision failed:

"I just returned from Africa, as you all know. And when I got over there, I had a restricted visa, and wouldn't let me, wouldn't let me preach because it gathers too many together."

Massive bear sign left on the tapes:

On May 6, 1962 William Branham prophesied on tape that he would shoot a huge brown bear:

"Remember it's on tape here, I seen a great huge brown bear. That might be a Kodiak...But wherever it will be, it'll be. It will be; that's **THUS SAITH THE LORD.** It will be. See?

He confirmed this prophecy in a sermon called "**Presuming**" on June 10, 1962:

"That you might know, when I come back next year. I'm going to get a brown bear that's almost twice that size. You see if it's right or not. ...God's perfect and never fails."

But he never shot the big brown bear he prophesied about.

Eggs that shouldn't have been stuck to a plate:

On July 21, 1963 in a sermon called "**He Cares, Do You?**" William Branham gave important dietary advice:

"It shall come to pass in the last days, don't live in a valley and don't eat eggs."

Then on April 25, 1965 he revealed that he fed his children eggs, even though he said it was the last days:

The kids had eat eggs for breakfast. And I poured this detergent in there, and dipped it in, dipped it out...[the plate] was still egggy."

Joseph got replaced with two angels:

William Branham first told of an important vision on December 23, 1962 in a sermon called "**Reproach for the cause of the Word**". This vision included his son Joseph, flocks of birds, and five angels.

"I was in the vision. But **I was talking to my son, Joseph**... in the shape of a pyramid, standing before me, was little **small birds**...from that came a larger bird, more like **doves**... I heard that explosion like, ...I thought, "Well, this must mean that I'm fixing to be killed...I thought, "No, it wouldn't be that, because **if it was a blast, it would've got Joseph too**"... I looked to the west; and it looked like in a form of a pyramid...came **five** of the mightiest Angels I ever seen in my life."

But when William Branham went hunting in March 1963, he left Joseph at home and no birds appeared. He also insisted that seven, rather than five angels, appeared.

"You may be wondering among yourselves, "How can we tell the difference, whether it was GOD who spoke or not?" Here's how: **If what the prophet spoke in GOD's name doesn't happen, then obviously GOD wasn't behind it; the prophet made it up. Forget about him.**" Deuteronomy 18:21-22 (The Message)
